2. OPEN FORUM

Jay Kulp, a Rogers resident who lives in the Laurel Creek Development was present to formally request the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) consider an enclosed dog run/park at Laurel Creek. Mr. Kulp came to this meeting prepared with a layout of the proposed dog park, and a quote from a fence contractor. Mr. Kulp plans to go door to door in his neighborhood to fund raise and look for grant writers for this new dog park. Before he begins fundraising, he would like to know if a dog park at Laurel Creek would be approved by the PRAC. After discussion, the PRAC approved Mr. Kulp to proceed with his efforts. The PRAC suggested he consider a four-foot vs a five-foot fence to cut down costs. Mr. Kulp will keep the PRAC informed as to how his project is going.

6. GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Laurel Creek Dog Park Request

See Open Forum.

Motion to add a dog run/park at Laurel Creek to the Master Park Plan pending successful fundraising by resident by Morrow, seconded by M. Volkers. Motion carried 6/0.

6.2 Review of Proposals for Territorial Park's Final Design and Construction Services

A Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued for Territorial Park's final design and construction services. The RFP was posted on the Rogers City Website and sent to nine firms. Inquiries were received from four firms and two firms, Anderson Engineering and SRF submitted proposals. We have worked with both firms in the past. Staff reviewed both proposals, all elements of the proposal considered, Anderson Engineering provided the lower of the two bids.

Motion to recommend Council approve the proposal from Anderson Engineering for the final design and construction services for Territorial Park by Hacker, seconded by Morrow. Motion carried 6/0.

6.3 Work Plan 2024 & 2025 Reviewed

Highlights:

- Construction has begun on the buildings at SCP and the new ice rinks there have been flooded. While the footings were being dug, water was found below the ground's surface. Engineering is reviewing options to mitigate this issue.
- Additional trails and a pump track to be installed at SCP were discussed. The PRAC is in favor of the additional trails, however after discussion would like to hold off on the pump track. They aren't sure of the demand for an amenity like this or if SCP is the right place for it. A public meeting will be held to provide information and to discuss the additional trails for SCP.
- The groundbreaking for the turf facility took place and the contractor began digging and pouring footings last week. The footings should be completed by the end of January 2025. Next, the panels will be tipped up. Construction is planned to be completed late in 2025.
- RFPs for new playground structures at North Community Park (NCP) will be sent out before the end of 2024.
- The PRAC asked if one or two hoops are currently at Fox Creek. Sometimes there are two very different age groups of players there and it would be nice if there were two height options of hoops for play. There is one, staff will check and see if it is possible to add another hoop.

Motion to approve the 2025 Work Plan by J. Volkers, seconded by Okland. Motion carried 6/0.

6.4 Bench and Little Library Donation

The Rogers Cub Scout, Pack 3582, has recycled tons of plastic wrap and bags. By doing this, they have earned several benches. They are also building a little library. Their Cubmaster approached staff about donating a recycled plastic bench/bench(s) and a small library. Staff would like directions on the acceptance and locations for these possible donations.

The PRAC suggested a donated bench be put at the dog park at Lynch Park.

6.5 Indoor Playground Style Recommendation

Staff have received four proposed playground styles for the indoor turf facility. The goal was to select a style that best meets our community's needs while balancing functionality, inclusivity and cost-effectiveness. Both multi-level and freestanding play equipment options were received. There is another local company staff would like to reach out as well. Funds for this play equipment will come from Park Dedication, not Local Option Sales Tax (LOST).

The multi-level structures were favored, and staff will go forward to obtain bids for that type of play structure.

6.6 Member Survey for Reappointment

Two or three Parks and Recreation Advisory Commissioners' terms end each year. We stagger the terms to ensure continuity of the commission. At the end of a term, commissioners are allowed to reapply for a three-year term. If a commissioner elects not to be reappointed, staff will advertise an opening on the PRAC for 2025.

Commissioners Paul Hacker, Mike Volkers and Sam Okland's terms expire this year. All of them reapplied for another three-year term. All re-appointments were approved.

Turf Allocation Policy

Purpose:

The Turf Allocation Policy ensures equitable, cost-effective, and sustainable operation of the facility while balancing local and citywide needs. It provides clear priorities for turf use and establishes a process for managing allocations in a way that meets current and future demands for both organized and casual participants, with special consideration for youth sport development.

Objectives

1. **Equity and Fiscal Responsibility:** Operate the facility in an equitable, cost-effective, and fiscally sustainable manner.
2. **Local and Citywide Balance:** Balance local services and needs with those of the City as a whole.
3. **Stakeholder Engagement:** Provide users and stakeholders the opportunity to influence policy implementation.
4. **Meeting Demand:** Address current and future needs for both organized and casual participants.
5. **Youth Sport Development:** Recognize the importance of municipal facilities in the development of youth sports and prioritize accommodating youth activities.

Allocation Priorities

1. **First Priority:**
 - a. City of Rogers Parks and Recreation programs and events.
2. **Second Priority:**
 - a. In-season Rogers High School sports until 6 PM.
3. **Third Priority:**
 - a. Tryouts, tournaments, and events lasting less than one week.
 - b. Allocations for this priority will follow the **weighted lottery system** based on:
 - i. 1 point for participants living within the Rogers High School attendance boundary.
 - ii. 1 point for Rogers residents.
 - iii. 2 points for Rogers residents who also live within the Rogers High School attendance boundary.
4. **Fourth Priority:**
 - a. Weekly or regular ongoing rentals lasting more than three consecutive weeks.
 - b. Allocations for this priority will also follow the **weighted lottery system** as described above.

Applications not fitting into these categories will be reviewed on a **first-come, first-served basis** after higher-priority requests have been processed.

Processing of Turf Allocations

Prime Season (October – May)

- **Application Deadline:** Requests for Prime Season turf time must be submitted by **April 4th 2025** for 2026 it would be the last business day of the year before the allocation year.
- **Allocation Deadline:** The Rogers Activity Center Manager will allocate Prime Season turf time by **May 1st 2025** for 2026 it would be by January 31 the current year.

Non-Prime Season (June – September)

- **Application Deadline:** Requests for Non-Prime Season turf time must be submitted by **December 1st** of the previous year.
- **Allocation Deadline:** The Rogers Activity Center Manager will allocate Non-Prime Season turf time by **December 31st** of the same year.

Late Applications

- Applications received **after these deadlines** will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Late applications will only be considered after those submitted on time have been allocated turf time according to their entitlement.

Youth Sport Development Considerations

In recognition of the role municipal facilities play in developing youth sports, special consideration will be given to youth-focused activities when determining allocations. This may include:

- Providing additional weight in the lottery system for youth organizations.
- Ensuring fair access to prime time slots for youth sports groups.

Annual Review and Policy Adjustments

This policy is intended as a multi-year framework for turf allocations. However, the **Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission** will:

- Review the policy and allocations annually.
- Reserve the right to deviate from the policy when it is deemed in the City's best interest.

Enforcement and Compliance:

Failure to adhere to residency requirements may result in revoked turf time allocations or restrictions on future bookings. Stakeholders are encouraged to provide feedback during the annual review process to ensure continuous improvement of the allocation system.

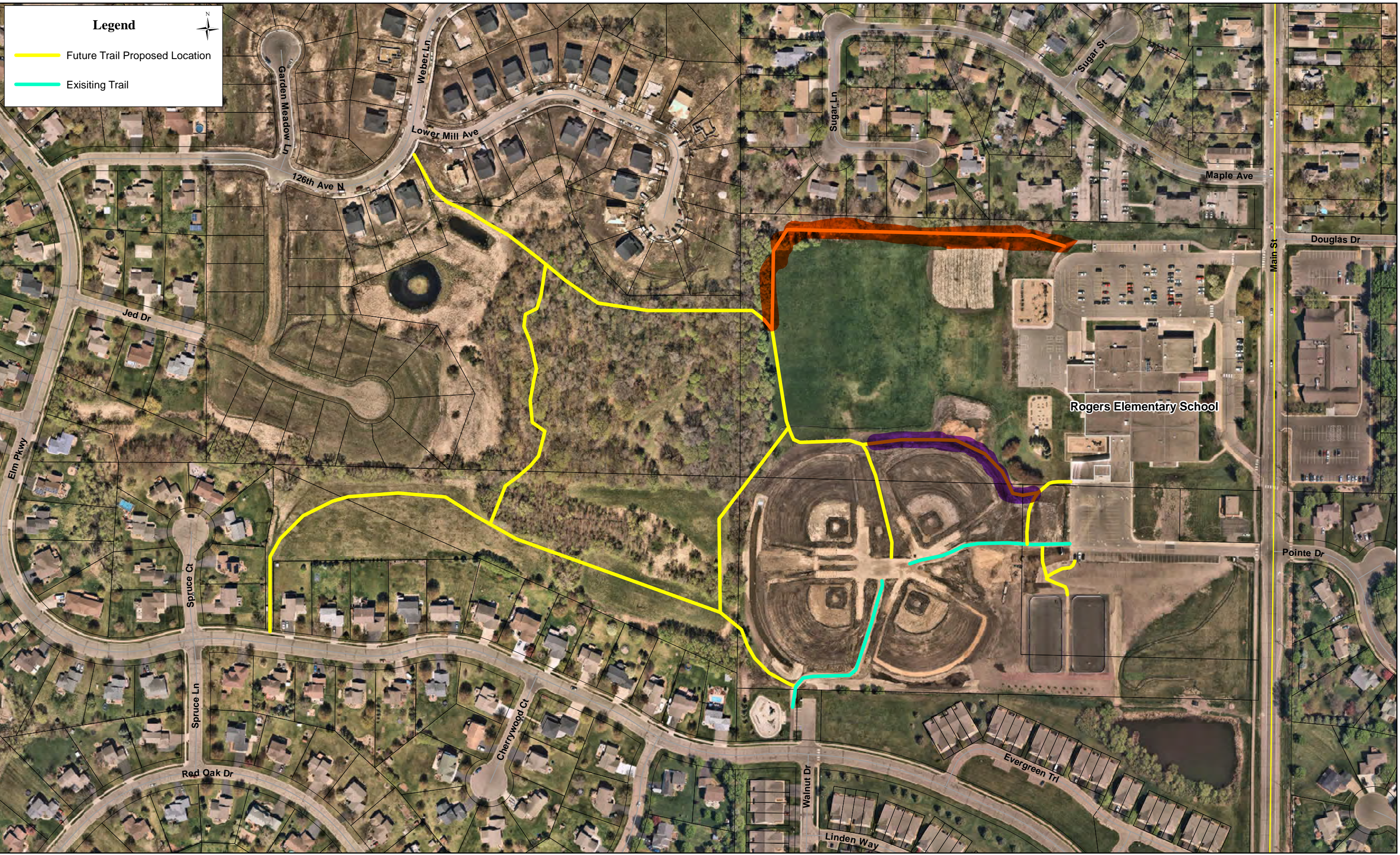

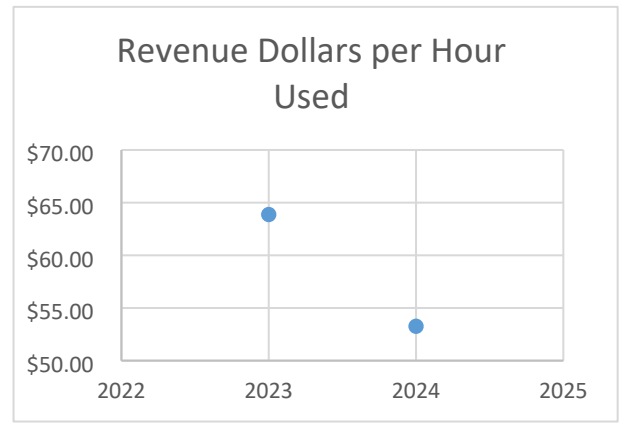

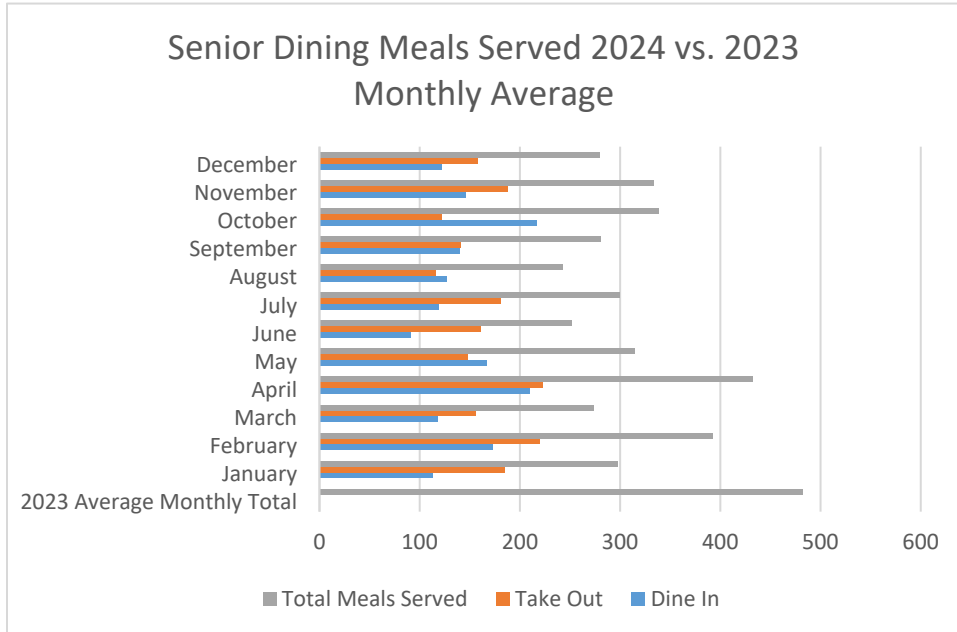

I heard from our HOA board that the city is moving forward with installing a pavilion at the park this summer. That's welcome news! Is there a timeline or design plan yet? I also wanted to follow up on the accessibility concerns I brought up last summer. With the new Lennar developments on the SW end of Rogers getting amazing facilities and park, it's understandably still frustrating to see the size and amenities our park has when we've got 500+ household units in our development. Is there any discussion for improving our park? Improving accessibility? Installing age appropriate equipment for 3-8 year olds and kids with disabilities?

I'm not sure what to expect for priorities for the new mayor, but I hope she sees the value in investing in the neighborhoods that are injecting a lot of the new money into the city (and not only property taxes).

Thanks for your continued partnership in working to improve our park.

Hi Beth,
Thank you for your email. I appreciate you reaching out and sharing your concerns. I will forward your input to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission for consideration.

Regarding the timeline for the picnic shelters, I am still in the process of gathering quotes. I need at least three price estimates, and I currently have two, but I hope that they can be ordered and installed in 2025.

While you and I, as parents, may not entirely agree with the age guidelines set by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM), these standards are established based on the physical abilities, average sizes, and developmental stages of children in different age groups. They are widely recognized as the national standard for playground design.

That said, I welcome your suggestions for improving the equipment and accessibility of the playground. If you have specific ideas or photos of features you'd like to see, I can explore potential suppliers and determine what might fit within the existing playground containers.

Additionally, I'd like to hear your thoughts on the features planned for the Southwest Rogers playgrounds. Which elements would you like to see incorporated into the Laurel Creek playground? Understanding your preferences will help us better align with your vision.

Thank you again for your feedback, and I look forward to hearing your thoughts.

I appreciate you getting back to me. Do you have any information what the options actually are for improved equipment to fit into the existing playground containers? If there are limited equipment

options to retrofit into the existing equipment, there's no need for me to come up with a dream list of equipment if those items wouldn't even be possible. In the 2017 Parks Master Plan, it looks like Laurel Creek is designated as a "neighborhood park" (not mini-neighborhood park) which is expected to serve a larger number of people within a certain radius. The development was started in 2017 and we've now grown to approximately 500 family units. When we first talked about the scope of the park being reduced due to the city not having enough funds to install all of the things that were originally discussed and planned, I was hoping that meant our park would be revisited for funding once the city had funds (like the funds currently being gathered for the new indoor facility next to the Activity Center). All of the new developments in the last 5-7 years have been paying our fair share of taxes but not seen that investment put back into our area of the city. I believe we are labeled as "future neighborhood park #5" and the considerations implied that the investment in the park would be higher since there are fewer parks being developed south of Territorial:

NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS #2,3,4,5

SERVICE AREA: Area most likely to be developed south of Territorial Road and parks function as part of a larger natural open space/greenway and trail system.

CONSIDERATIONS

- Utilizing the greenway system, service areas can be expanded to ½-mile or slightly more since the trails and open space become part of the park experience requiring fewer neighborhood parks to be developed while still meeting neighborhood needs.
- With fewer parks to develop, the level of investment in each park can be higher with the same overall level of investment by the City and/or developer, resulting in a higher quality experience for local residents.

When looking at the master plan for Territorial Park, there are several photos showing examples of inclusive play for both 2-5 and 5-12 year olds, as well as sensory play. I'd be interested to see the detailed photos of possible equipment because from what I can tell from the website, the equipment is not 90% ropes and disc platforms that are positioned over the heads of most 5-12 year olds. The Laurel Creek Park could be so much more inclusive if the equipment wasn't mostly comprised of rope-centric items and had more activities/platforms that are situated 0-3 feet above the ground.

What has been decided in terms of rubber mats under the swings (to reduce the distance that kids would need to reach up in order to get into a swing)? I understand that the placement of the chains cannot be lowered but would like to see the ground/base raised, so to speak.

What size do you anticipate for the new shelter? Where will it be installed and will it have tables/seating under it?

It looked like the city had installed sprinklers to water the grass at the park this past season--is that correct? If so, would that allow for the possibility of adding a water fountain to the park since there is an irrigation source?

Thanks again for hearing me out and working together to try to improve our neighborhood. I know many of our residents would be happy to weigh in on feedback for park improvements as well.

Mike,

There are few things you could consider adding to the space to increase the sensory experience.

1. Music equipment - most of the music options could be added in the open areas between the sidewalk and the use zone of the existing equipment or a separate pad adjacent to the current container.
 - a. Music equipment is easy to add into the space and has a variety of options and price points.
2. Sand Play – a sand play could be added adjacent to the current play area. Components could include an elevated sand table, diggers & fossil digs
